



House of Life Exhibition: closing soon!

The House of Life Exhibition at the Library at Willesden Green invites a new audience to a never-before-seen showcase of the heritage of London's pre-eminent Victorian Jewish Cemetery, which has quietly served London's Jews in a little-known corner of Willesden since 1873.

The displays introduce visitors to the fascinating lives of selected individuals buried there, describe the Jewish approach to death and mourning, and give a glimpse of the cemetery buildings and landscape. The exhibition further invites us all to reflect on the people we have lost and how we like to remember them. Hurry, as the exhibition closes on 16 February!
