Willesden Cemetery is one of London's most prestigious Jewish Cemeteries. It was opened in 1873.

Chief Rabbi Joseph Herman Hertz 1872 - 1946 Chief Rabbi 1913 - 1946

Chief Rabbi Israel Brodie 1895 - 1979 Chief Rabbi 1948 - 1965

Sir Julius Vogel 1835 - 1899 Prime Minister of New Zealand

Rosalind Franklin 1920 - 1958 Co discoverer of DNA

Marcus Samuel 1853 - 1927 1st Viscount Bearstead, banker and a founder of Shell Oil Company
